

It was a very long road to recovery as he had a terrible broken leg, a hernia, fleas, and heartworm. He came from Texas, so I had to teach him how we yanks call a dog. Fritz came to me in November, very fearful of men, but immediately bonded with me and his four sisters. He even lets my bossy Frenchie, Tubby, push him around! He ignores my parrots ... who shout out "GRANPA" to him when he goes by. Apparently, they cannot tell the difference between him and my other dog who passed. He loves his chicken necks!

He is still fearful of certain men but has come a long way. Fritz loved my nephew when he visited at Christmas. He has a heated bed, a Ralph Lauren quilt, and the zebra throw he came with. I think he is happy. I love him. I believe he loves me.

"Let's just put in an application and see what happens. It will probably take a long time anyway, so let's start now." Well, fortunately for us, it moved faster than that.

Ever since we became a couple, we knew we wanted a Boxer. Rob grew up with Boxers and had one special rescue, Minnie, at the time we met. Mike fell in love with the cute faces and personalities of Boxers and had grown up with dogs surrounding him and his family. She is making great strides in potty training. She is climbing stairs. She is beginning to enjoy life. We are so glad she is home and we could not love her more! 
Maggie Adopted 1/2/22

Maggie the Boxer. I have had many dogs over my lifetime and have loved them all. I have raised four Boxers over the past 12 years. The first two were brother and sister, both were brindle. Then a white deaf girl that we rescued about 10 years ago. Four years ago I fostered and adopted Annie, a sealed brindle and white Boxer. She died in May from a heart condition. I was totally devastated and have been searching for a new girlfriend since that time. I applied with a couple of rescue groups. On December 3, I was contacted about RCBR receiving several rescues and wondering if I was interested. I said definitely and two days later I had Maggie in my arms. She is a gorgeous fawn and white girl. She is a rescue from a breeding farm and not used to people, but in the past six weeks she has warmed up to me very well. Thank you so much RCBR.



Mike (n/k/a Noveske) Adopted 1/29/22

Noveske came to us as just a message from Stacy asking if I could help one of 12 breeder farm release dogs that were set to come in on an emergency pull. Other than a number, we knew nothing about any of



these dogs.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with what a "mill/breeder release dog" is, their situation can best be explained as overbred and forgotten.

Their situations range anywhere from a backyard breeder who simply does not spay or neuter their animals, to literally sitting in a cage and never seeing humans or daylight ... other than to be bred. Most are terrified of human touch. Some are so severely neglected and/or abused they may never be someone's idea of a a "normal" dog.

Noveske was no exception. When he arrived after his two-day transport, he was stuck to the back of his kennel. He tried his hardest to make himself as small as he possibly could, in hopes we would just forget that he was there. I had to carry him in the house and quickly realized that he was covered, and I mean COVERED, in fleas. He was absolutely filthy! I doubt he had ever had a bath in his entire life.

Due to his flea infestation, he spent three days in the "puppy room" in our basement. He literally did not leave that room, except for flea baths. The best thing I could do for him right away was to basically ignore him and let him acclimate on his own time. Less was more!

On day four, I started the rotation of slowly introducing him to my dogs. He eventually ended up with the baby gate between them all and that was when I *finally* saw him trying to be a dog. He **loves** my dogs, they are his comfort. He needed them to help him learn how to dog and that is what they continue to do.

He has been here about a month and has come **so** far. He now sleeps with us, is 92% potty trained, loves to play and even gives me wiggle butt when I come home after being gone. He is fascinated by my children and is now letting me pet him randomly without fear.

The smallest changes still rock his world and sometimes cause him to revert back to that feral stage, but he is continuously reassured that this can be his safe place.


I have had close to 20 fosters and this one just hit differently. I have a three rule limit or I would become a hoarder (it is easy to do with Boxers) and that would defeat my purpose in rescue.

So, with this adoption, my foster (not rescue) career is on hold for the time being. I cannot thank Rejection Collection Boxer Rescue enough for helping save these dogs. Our village is the best, and I am honored to be a part of all of this!

Rejection Collection Boxer Rescue matched me with my perfect dog, Ringo. After going through the vetting process, it was determined that Ringo was the perfect dog for me and they were not wrong!. We have had Ringo, now known as Louie, for 14 days and he is a true love. Every day is a new venture for Louie. Changing his name was not traumatic for him because he did not answer to Ringo ... or anything else. He is beginning to understand that Louie is his name. He wags his tail now when he sees me and my wife, has started licking us, and howls when I leave the room (just like a human baby when their parent out of sight). Louie loves the attention our two grandchildren give him, especially the ear rubs. Every day he goes for a nice long walk, and we think he knows when it is walk time because he starts whining. He *loves* his naps. He curls up on one of his four beds throughout the house and snores away.

We are working on the basic commands with him - sit, stay, and paw, while also working on him playing with his toys. He loves to play with our fur granddogs, but he does not quite get the game of tug-o-war! We have had many Boxers over the years and love the breed. We are starting to see some of the silly Boxer personality coming out in Louie. We are happy that we are able to give a 6-year-old dog from a puppy mill a second chance. Thank you to everyone who assisted with getting Louie to us - the coordinator, vetting team, fosters, and transport team. You are truly special people and the dogs are lucky to have you looking out for them. Thank you.

White Thor Adopted 1/10/22



Unfortunately, I gently told him that is not in the best interest of anyone, so he is going to have to admire them quietly from the living room window, which he seems ok with.

Guss Crossed the Bridge 1/17/22



Molly (f/k/a Poppy) Crossed the Bridge 1/7/22


