Rejection Collection Boxer Rescue was where I found him. He is perfect for me because Beans has a disability, and so do I. I am a cancer survivor currently battling a secondary diagnosis. Beans is a deaf Boxer. We are the perfect match.

I met Lucy from RCBR at the kennel where Beans was learning to cope with his anxiety and be a happy dog again. The first day we met, I knew he was really an angel that was sent to heal me. I have struggled with anxiety, depression, and not feeling like I was good enough. Cancer changed my mind and my body forever. I felt like a broken Barbie that nobody wanted.

Beans has a lot of anxiety from his disability. He has confidence issues as well. I believe we were sent to heal each other.

It has been a couple of months now and my heart is happy again. Beans and I live in a lovely apartment, we snuggle in bed, and we walk around the city at night soaking in the world around us. Beans has given me the love I was missing. And the confidence I had lost, he has returned to me.

Lucy, an angel herself, helped guide me through the process of adjusting Beans to his new home. She has answered my late-night calls when I was worried about medication. She even helped doggie sit Beans for me while I went to work so he was not alone. I cannot thank her enough for her generosity, guidance, and love for Beans.

He has adjusted perfectly to his life with me. We have a routine together that he relies on just as much as I do. If I did not have Beans, I would still feel like that broken Barbie. He is my rescue Boxer who rescued me. I love you Beans!!

I must thank Rejection Collection Boxer Rescue for helping me with a crate for Beans, dog food, medications, and guidance. I would not have been a successful doggie mom without them. Thank you so much for allowing Beans to rescue me too!

Jack

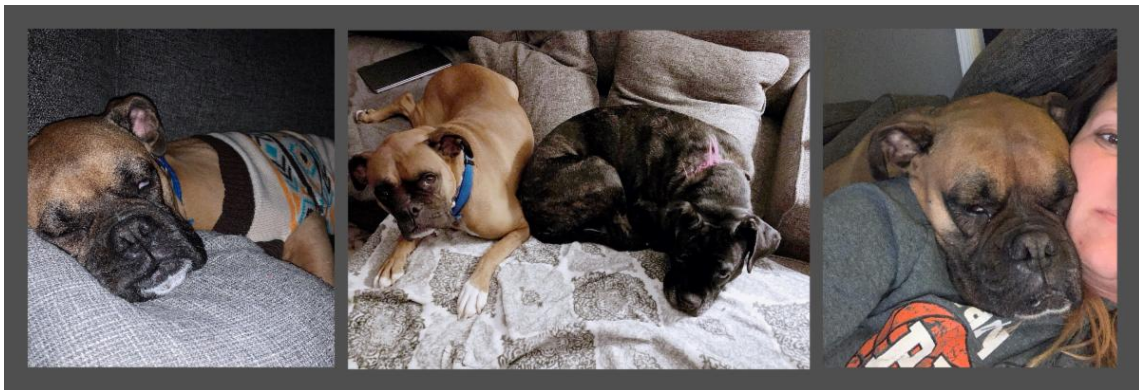
Adopted 6/13/22

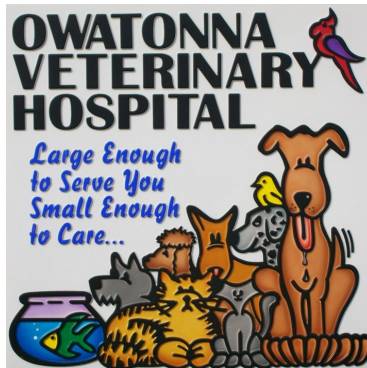

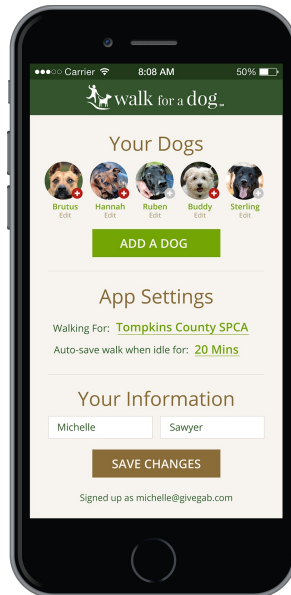
