Gnats Are Back



Spring and early Summer are a peak time for black fly bites (gnats) in the Upper Midwest

Vets see many cases of black fly bites this time of year, fielding dozens of calls from concerned pet owners. Even if you use a regular flea and tick preventative, your dog may still get bitten. Thankfully, black fly bites aren't usually a serious medical concern.

Black fly bites typically heal without treatment. While they can be sore or itchy, pets recover within a few days. As with any skin lesion, keep the area clean using a pet-safe soap and antibacterial cream, and prevent your pet from licking or scratching.

KEEP YOUR BEST FRIEND AT EASE:

EXERCISE DURING THE DAY. Ensure your dog gets plenty of exercise during the day to tire them out

STAY HOME. Don't bring them to events where fireworks will be set off

MAKE THEM FEEL SAFE. Provide a safe place at home with music or the TV playing

ACT NORMAL. Don't acknowledge the fireworks, as your dog may be looking to you on how to react

Volunteer Spotlight

Jennifer Mazur-McCombs



I am a Volunteer Animal Transporter. I have always been an animal lover and my last three dogs were all adopted. I knew the plight of shelter dogs but sadly just could not adopt any more at the time. So, I continued to donate and drop off supplies to shelters, but I wanted to be more involved with the rescue world. In 2013, I saw a plea for drivers to transport local shelter dogs to rescues. It sounded *perfect* for me as I love to drive anyway! I saw a Boxer in need and knew I had to be first to sign up on this one. Boxers are my heart dog and by that point, I had three Boxers and two Boxer-mixes of my own. And that is how my journey began nine years ago!

My first transport was a Boxer named Chuck in March 2013. He was in a horrible shelter with limited time left and got his Freedom Ride to Joliet, Illinois. I wish I could tell you how many dogs I have driven over the years. I take tons of pictures and keep track that way but have never kept count. It has definitely been hundreds! We have driven the usual dogs and cats, but have also transported raccoons, ferrets, bunnies, other small animals, several pigs - both large and small - and even some goats! I say "we", because typically I bring someone along with me. My mom usually comes along and loves transporting with me. She is often my navigator. She gets all her doggie lovin' in on the transports. My husband has joined me on a few transports as well. I tried fostering once. Sadly, that is not my thing, but thankfully that guy is still with me (foster fail, HA!).

We have met some of the *best*, most generous, kind-hearted people when transporting. It is a great feeling to find your place and your people in the rescue world. Transporting is kind of like a paid volunteer position. We get paid in doggie love and kisses. It is definitely worth it!

I also make blankets for a group called Blanketing Boxers with Love. They send blankets to Boxer rescue groups, so each dog has something of their very own to take with them to their forever homes.

Sometimes I still feel like I am not doing enough. Every aspect of volunteering is so important. Without each "job" we cannot save these lives. That is the most important thing ... saving as many animals as possible and helping them on their journey to the good life!





Mission Statement


