Volunteer Spotlight Dakota Willett



Willow (n/k/a Cinder) Adopted 3/17/22



RCBR received three day's notice about 11 Boxers needing rescue (a number that unexpectedly grew to 12 when transport arrived). Given nothing more than a list of 11 dogs consisting of two lines of information for each dog including a number, name, sex, approximate age and a couple words about coat color, RCBR scrambled to find Fosters and transportation logistics. I volunteered to take the oldest female, which was Willow, a 6year old brindle. On the day of pick-up, Willow was actually determined to be a sealed brindle, most often incorrectly referred to as a black Boxer. She was gorgeous, but typical of all commercial breeder release dogs/puppy mill dogs, she was terrified when taken out of the transport van. They all were. Safe to say, this was probably the first time any of these dogs had ever felt the kind touch of human hands, heard they were beautiful or handsome, or spoken to with soothing voices. Having lived their entire life in a kennel. only let out to breed, that became their familiar routine. Dogs are creatures of habit so the unfamiliar is scary - no matter how horrific that familiar was. Mill breeder girls have my heart, I enjoy watching them slowly come out of their shell and learn how wonderful it is to be a dog. A loved dog! As always, my pack makes the decision on who can stay. It has to work both ways - the pack and the newbie need to get along. I, on the other hand, would take in absolutely every dog I see. But it is not fair to either side to force it. Willow has become known as Cinder and now has three Boxer siblings. These dogs all come out on their own terms/schedule, are broken emotionally and physically, and typically carry parts of their past forever. Cinder is still learning to be a dog, learning to trust, learning to enjoy life, but she and the rest of the Tremendous 12 will never know fear, neglect, pain, hunger, or heartbreak again.




